Goals/Intended Training Outcomes:

After this workshop you will be able to...

- name examples of (culturally) diverse experiences of teaching and learning.
- explain the advantages of diversity for problem-solving (processes/results).
- reflect on the challenges and opportunities of intercultural teaching and learning situations.
- recognize and value individually different learning histories.
- consider phenomena from social and educational psychology relevant to intercultural interaction/communication/collaboration in your teaching.
- use tools and approaches to harness diversity in your teaching.

Contents:

- Identification of intercultural learning & teaching situations, aspects of diversity, and related chances and challenges
- Concepts, approaches and tools from social and educational psychology relevant to intercultural interaction/collaboration/communication
- Advantages of diversity to problem-solving from a scientific perspective

Methods:

- Group-work
- Individual reflection based on prompts
- Trainer impulses
- Discussion/experience sharing
