

12 Steps for Start of Studies for Internationals at KIT

1	<p>Finding accommodation: In most cities with good universities it is difficult to find accommodation. This is also the case in Karlsruhe. So please start looking for accommodation early as possible. You can get help from the Studierendenwerk Karlsruhe. They also have a housing scout who can assist you. It is easier to find an accommodation outside Karlsruhe. Fortunately, Karlsruhe has a very good transportation system and you can quickly get to KIT by bus or streetcar even from further away. The Deutschlandticket lets you travel anywhere in Germany on most regional and local trains. Students can order the ticket here. You can find further information on this page.</p> <p>Unfortunately, it will no longer be financially supported from April and will then cost as much as the normal D-Ticket. The D-Ticket JugendBW is available for students under the age of 27 years. 2	<p>Registration of Your Residence: When you move into an accommodation, you must notify the competent authority. You must do this within the first 2 weeks.</p> <p>All students who <i>move within Karlsruhe</i> can register online. You can find all the information you need at https://web1.karlsruhe.de/service/Buergerdienste/leistung.php?id=6002497. You can use the Universal-Onlinedienst (Meldewesen) (universal registration assistant, 2nd page) to register your place of residence. Under "Ihr Anliegen" (your request) please enter: „Anmeldung des Einzugs in eine neue Wohnung nach §23 Absatz 1 Bundesmeldegesetz“ (Registration of moving into a new apartment according to §23 paragraph 1 of the Federal Registration Act).</p> <p>If you would like to make an appointment with the authorities, you can do so on this page: https://www.karlsruhe.de/stadt-rathaus/service-buergerinformation/terminvereinbarung.</p> <p>All students who come <i>to Karlsruhe or the surrounding area from abroad</i> must go to a citizens' office in person. Please register via the link: https://karlsruhe.de/stadt-rathaus/service-buergerinformation/terminvereinbarung.</p> <p>You will need the following items for registration: Wohnungsgeberbescheinigung (the landlord must fill this out), Meldeschein (registration form: you must fill this out), passport and the electronic residence permit or your visa. 3	<p>Applying for a Residence Title: Before your entry visa expires, it is essential that you apply for an eAT (electronic residence title = residence permit) to study at the local Aliens Registration Office. The Aliens Registration Office depends on your place of residence: Ausländerbehörde Stadt Karlsruhe (Aliens Registration Office City of Karlsruhe), Ausländerbehörde Landratsamt Karlsruhe (Aliens Registration Office District Office Karlsruhe).</p> <p>For further information please have a look at the page: https://www.intl.kit.edu/istudies/12699.php.</p>	<p>Residence in Karlsruhe: Ausländerbehörde Kaiserallee 8, 76124 Karlsruhe</p> <p>Residence in the district of Karlsruhe: Landratsamt Karlsruhe Kriegsstr. 100, 76133 Karlsruhe</p>
4	<p>Semester Charges: Please pay your semester charges! The amount can be found in the notification of charges. Use the bank data and the individual purpose of payment given in the information letter. Please keep your account statement/receipt for enrollment. Pay by bank transfer from your home country OR from a bank account in Germany.</p> <p>You will have to re-register every semester by paying your semester charges in advance and continue to have a health insurance.</p> <p>Registration periods: Summer semester: January 15 – February 15, Winter semester: July 1 – August 15. If you pay too late, you will have to pay 15 € in addition. If you do not pay at all, you will be exmatriculated.</p>	<p>From at home/upon arrival in Karlsruhe, PRIOR TO enrollment</p> <p>Re-register online: https://campus.studium.kit.edu/english/renewal/index.php</p>
5	<p>Health insurance: For enrollment, KIT needs an electronic notification for the health insurance. Please ask your health insurance provider for "Meldegrund 10 für das Karlsruher Institut für Technologie".</p> <p>Please read this further information about health insurance: https://www.intl.kit.edu/istudies/12698.php</p>	Upon arrival in Germany or digitally from your country
6	<p>Enrollment: The page https://www.intl.kit.edu/istudies/12708.php describes what you need to do in sequence for online enrollment (matriculation).</p>	Upon arrival in Karlsruhe or digitally from your country with a visa to study
7	<p>KIT-Account & Studierendenausweis: On the page https://www.scc.kit.edu/en/services/firstsemester.php you can find all information how to get a KIT-Account (KIT user account - KIT-Benutzerkonto) and a KIT-Card (student ID - Studierendenausweis). 9	<p>O-Phasen (Orientation Phasen): The student council is a group of students in the department. They organize orientation phases (O-Phasen) for all new students at the beginning of their studies. You can find an overview of the dates of the O-Phasen on the ASTA page or ask the faculty. Please be sure to attend your program's O-Phase to receive important information about your studies and to get to know your fellow students.</p> <p>Many departments offer mentoring-programs for first semester students. 10	<p>Important offers on campus: You will find an extensive range of events and support formats for international students from our partners. Please inform yourself about the offer and participate.</p>	See respective link

11	<p>Updating Your Data on the Students Portal: As soon as you have an accommodation or move in, update your <u>new address</u>. This also has to be done when you move later on during your studies.</p> <p>In Campus Management you will manage most things during your studies, such as registering for an exam. 12	<p>Opening a Bank Account: This is only possible with a rental contract, registration of residence and your tax number (from the Tax Office). Usually, the tax number will be sent to you by the Tax Office 14 days upon registration with the city. To open a bank account, you will need your passport, registration with the city, admission letter/enrollment certificate, tax number. Most banks offer to have the account opened online in combination with PostIdent (at a post office). Complete the form online. To identify yourself via PostIdent, complete the form online and take the documents to a post office.</p>	<p>Many banks offer cost-free accounts for students. Inform yourself on the websites.</p>
